Designed for eighth- and ninth-graders and tightly aligned with the SAT®, PSAT/NMSQT®, and PSAT™ 10, the PSAT 8/9 establishes a baseline for college and career readiness as students enter high school. It tests the same skills and knowledge as the SAT, PSAT/NMSQT, and PSAT 10 — in a way that makes sense for your grade level.

The PSAT 8/9 measures the reading, writing and language, and math skills you need for college and a career. After the test, you'll receive feedback on how ready you are for college along with tools to help you improve.
